## TH 451 History of the Theatre I

Senior level writing intensive course examining the social, philosophical, and artistic conditions in which theatre and performance practices emerge, take shape, and change up to the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Course covers the study of theatre's origins, Greek tragedy, Dramatic Theory, Theatre and Religion, Neoclassicism, and Theatre, Entertainment, and State.

#### TH 452 History of the Theatre II

Senior level writing intensive course covering the period in western theatre from late 18th century Romanticism to the current 21st century theatre.

#### TH 245 Teaching Theatre: Performance (taught 2 Sections)

Survey of the practical and theoretical knowledge necessary to teach theatre. Topics include acting, directing, choosing plays for production, and rehearsal techniques.

#### **Beginning Drama**
